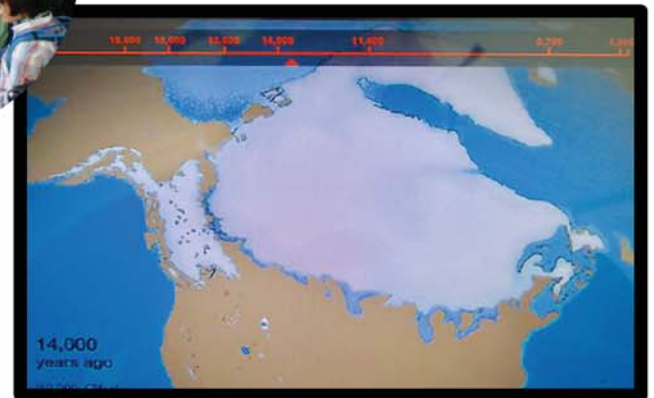
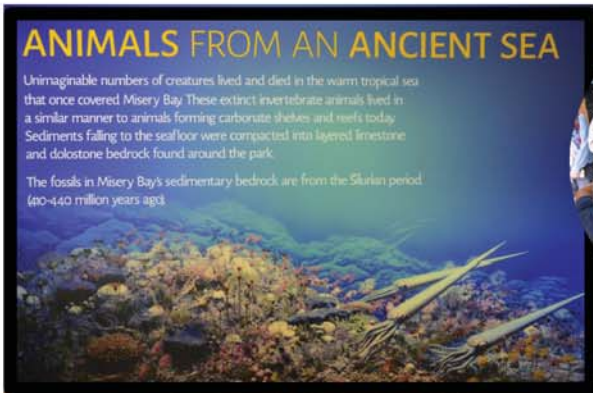


New World-Class Exhibits at the Misery Bay Provincial Park Created by Science North!

The interactive exhibits are both educational and entertaining.



When you walk the trails at Misery Bay, you travel across the floor of an ancient seabed. The new interactive map at the Visitor Centre explains points of interest along the trails. Press the dots and you will see what's so special about Misery Bay.



The Misery Bay Visitor Centre is open to the public every day throughout the summer, and on weekends during the shoulder season. It's like a mini Science North!

These are a few of the new displays that we believe will generate greater interest in Manitoulin Island as visitors come to see what is so special here. Actually, it's the alvar habitat! What is alvar? It's the remains of millions of sea creatures that have compacted over 400 million years to form limestone and dolostone rock. Thousands of years ago glaciers scraped away everything that covered the limestone, leaving a rock pavement that is home to species specially adapted to this habitat.
